Collect

Eternal God,
whose Son went among the crowds
and brought healing with his touch:
help us to show his love,
in your Church as we gather together,
and by our lives as they are transformed
into the image of Christ our Lord.

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15. 12-20

Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead?

If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain.

We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised.

For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins.

Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

Gospel: Luke 6. 17-26

He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon.

They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured.

And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.

Then he looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.

"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.

Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.

"Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.

"Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep.

"Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

Pray, Pause, Ponder...

Praying for your community and neighbours

Prayer Pots

This is a great way of blessing your community and yourself.

You will need:

Two small pots or baskets - big enough to hold several strips of paper or card and for you to dip your hand in without looking!
Pen

Pot 1...write on the strips of card all the roads, churches, local businesses, playing fields absolutely everything in your community. (I used the parish mag to help me with this.)

Pot 2.... is filled with everyone you can think of neighbours, friends, family all those you know personally. (I also add those who have asked me to pray for them and those who come to mind) Each day set aside a time (i.e. breakfast) to pull one name from the street pot and three from the people pot.

Pray for the place and the people. The prayer is to just bless the place or person- nothing specific, just ask God to bless that place or the person and provide them with everything they need that day, that their needs will be met.

Next day, replace the names into the correct pot and then re -draw.

This is such a great way to cover our parish in prayer why not give it a go!
