Collect

Lord of heaven and earth,
as Jesus taught his disciples to be persistent in prayer, give us patience and courage never to lose hope, but always to bring our prayers before you; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Psalm 71:1-6

In you, O LORD, I take refuge; let me never be put to shame.
In your righteousness deliver me and rescue me; incline your ear to me and save me.
Be to me a rock of refuge, strong fortress, to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress.

Rescue me, O my God, from the hand of the wicked, from the grasp of the unjust and cruel.
For you, O Lord, are my hope, my trust, O LORD, from my youth.
Upon you I have leaned from my birth; it was you who took me from my mother's womb.
My praise is continually of you.

Reading: Psalm 139

O LORD, you have searched me and known me.
You know when I sit down and when I rise up;
you discern my thoughts from far away.
You search out my path and my lying down,
and are acquainted with all my ways.
Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD,
you know it completely.
You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me.
Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.
Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence?
If I ascend to heaven, you are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there.
If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast.

If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light around me become night," even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you.
For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.
I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well.
My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth.
Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed.
How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!

I try to count them—they are more than the sand; I come to the end—I am still with you.
O that you would kill the wicked, O God, and that the bloodthirsty would depart from me— those who speak of you maliciously, and lift themselves up against you for evil!
Do I not hate those who hate you, O LORD? And do I not loathe those who rise up against you?
I hate them with perfect hatred; I count them my enemies.
Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts.
See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

Gospel: Mark 11: 24-25

So I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.
"Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone; so that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses."

For further reflection

Continue reading the Psalms and making notes of the verses that resonate with you, take courage as you start building up your own psalm. As we begin expressing some of our deepest yearnings (feelings), we are reminded that we are not completely whole, we remember that we are simply human beings doing the best we can. Sometimes life seems to be going very well and we feel triumphant at one with the world, and at other times it feels as though the world is moving at such a pace we feel left behind. Nothing highlights this more as when we see friends and family starting something new. We can react in various ways, we can enjoy their pleasure as they prepare for the new adventure, but we can also be deeply jealous or even hurt that they are going and we feel abandoned. These are very real feelings and we need to spend some time acknowledging their presence otherwise they will limit the opportunities that we might enjoy, they will reduce our capacity to make new friends and try new things.
As you pray this week, talk to God about the hurts that are still hurting, the feelings of loss that have been experienced, and then allow God some time to minister to you. As your prayer time comes to a close give thanks for the special friendships you have enjoyed -from the past and those you enjoy today. Finish by reading Psalm 100 if this feels appropriate or the Lord's prayer if you prefer.
