# 16th Sunday after Trinity — 6th October 2019

## Collect

Lord of creation,  
whose glory is around and within us:  
open our eyes to your wonders,  
that we may serve you with reverence  
and know your peace at our lives' end,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

## Psalm 137. 1-6

By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down  
and there we wept when we remembered Zion.  
On the willows there we hung up our harps.  
For there our captors asked us for songs, and  
our tormentors asked for mirth, saying, "Sing  
us one of the songs of Zion!"

How could we sing the LORD's song in a foreign  
land? If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my  
righthand wither!

Let my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth, if  
I do not remember you,  
if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy.

## Reading: Genesis 28. 10-22

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward  
Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed  
there for the night, because the sun had set.  
Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it  
under his head and lay down in that place. And  
he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on  
the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven;  
and the angels of God were ascending and de-  
scending on it. And the LORD stood beside him  
and said, "I am the LORD, the God of Abraham  
your father and the God of Isaac; the land on  
which you lie I will give to you and to your off-  
spring; and your offspring shall be like the  
dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad  
to the west and to the east and to the north  
and to the south; and all the families of the  
earth shall be blessed in you and in your off-  
spring. Know that I am with you and will keep  
you wherever you go, and will bring you back  
to this land; for I will not leave you until I have  
done what I have promised you." Then Jacob  
woke from his sleep and said, "Surely the LORD

is in this place—and I did not know it!" And he  
was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place!  
This is none other than the house of God, and this  
is the gate of heaven."

So Jacob rose early in the morning, and he took  
the stone that he had put under his head and set  
it up for a pillar and poured oil on the top of it. He  
called that place Bethel; but the name of the city  
was Luz at the first. Then Jacob made a vow,  
saying, "If God will be with me, and will keep me  
in this way that I go, and will give me bread to  
eat and clothing to wear, so that I come again to  
my father's house in peace, then the LORD shall  
be my God, and this stone, which I have set up  
for a pillar, shall be God's house; and of all that  
you give me I will surely give one-tenth to you."

## Gospel: Luke 6. 27-37

But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies,  
do good to those who hate you, bless those who  
curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If any-  
one strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also;  
and from anyone who takes away your coat do  
not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone  
who begs from you; and if anyone takes away  
your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to  
others as you would have them do to you.

"If you love those who love you, what credit is  
that to you? For even sinners love those who love  
them. If you do good to those who do good to  
you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners  
do the same. If you lend to those from whom you  
hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even  
sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again.  
But love your enemies, do good, and lend,  
expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be  
great, and you will be children of the Most High;  
for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wick-  
ed. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not  
condemn, and you will not be condemned. For-  
give, and you will be forgiven;

**Psalm 66. 1-10,20**
