Collect

God of constant mercy,
who sent your Son to save us:
remind us of your goodness,
increase your grace within us,
that our thankfulness may grow,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Psalm 139: 1-7

O LORD, you have searched me and known me.
You know when I sit down and when I rise up;
you discern my thoughts from far away.
You search out my path and my lying
down, and are acquainted with all my ways.
Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD,
you know it completely.
You hem me in, behind and before, and lay
your hand upon me.
Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is
so high that I cannot attain it.
Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can
I flee from your presence?

Reading: Jeremiah 29: 4-7

Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel,
to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile
from Jerusalem to Babylon: Build houses and
live in them; plant gardens and eat what they
produce. Take wives and have sons and
daughters; take wives for your sons, and give
your daughters in marriage, that they may
bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and
do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the
city where I have sent you into exile, and pray
to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you
will find your welfare.

Gospel: Matthew 6: 5-15

And whenever you pray, do not be like the
hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in
the synagogues and at the street corners, so
that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell
you, they have received their reward. But

whenever you pray, go into your room and shut
the door and pray to your Father who is in secret;
and your Father who sees in secret will reward
you.

“When you are praying, do not heap up empty
phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that
they will be heard because of their many words.
Do not be like them, for your Father knows what
you need before you ask him.

“Pray then in this way:
Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come.
Your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And do not bring us to the time of trial,
but rescue us from the evil one.

For if you forgive others their trespasses, your
heavenly Father will also forgive you; but if you
do not forgive others, neither will your Father
forgive your trespasses.
