Holy Trinity Church News

From the 10th—16th 'November **1914-1918 Those who Served**' exhibition will be held in the church during the opening hours of the church. This is four years work, by the Westbury Area Family History group, to create a roll of honour to all those in the town and surrounding villages to go to war and returned. It will give individual profiles of the men from Dilton Marsh who went to war, their families, their work and where they lived. There will also be a poppy display of over 3000 knitted and crochet poppies created by the local community. This is a free exhibition. NB. The exhibition will be closed on Friday morning for a funeral to take place.

Praise the LORD!

Sing to the LORD a new song, his praise in the assembly of the faithful. Let Israel be glad in its Maker; let the children of Zion rejoice in their King.

Let them praise his name with dancing, making melody to him with tambourine and lyre. For the LORD takes pleasure in his people; he adorns the humble with victory. Let the faithful exult in glory; let them sing for joy on their couches. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."


